



After Your Procedure

Post Procedure Instructions

Proper care following your procedure is necessary to achieve the best results. Keep in mind that in many cases, some unevenness of colour is to be expected after the first application. This is the purpose of the follow up visit.

Eyeliner & Brows

No lotions, creams or water on the treated area for at least 72 hours after the procedure, including ice packs and eye drops.

Wearing glasses outdoors is a good way to protect new eyeliner from dust, etc that can stick to healing agents.

No make-up is to be applied directly to the treated area for 72 hours after procedure.

Do not use an eyelash curler or have an eyelash perm or tint for at least 3 weeks.

Lip Liner & Colour

No lotions, creams or water on the treated area for at least 12 hours after procedure.

After a lip procedure, avoid spicy foods or heat for a few days.

After the 12 hours apply a small amount of lubrication to the area (Laser gel, Polisorbin, or Zambuc). If fever blisters occur, please call me or contact your pharmacist.

Please Note:

Wash your hands before touching any treated area. Do not expose the area to dirty or unsanitary conditions. Some itching or sensitivity is normal.

DO NOT PICK, PEEL OR SCRATCH the treated area, or your colour may heal unevenly and you risk scarring and infection.

Do not expose your healing skin to direct sunlight, tanning beds, steam rooms, sauna's, salt water, chlorinated pools, direct shower spray, hot water, skin creams, ointments or lotions other than what you have been advised to used, for one week following your procedure.

Long Term Care:

Use a good sun screen daily-even lips require protection. Sun exposure will fade your permanent cosmetics.

If you are planning a chemical peel, MRI or other medical procedures, please inform your physician of your permanent make-up.

If you donate blood, it is a Blood Bank policy that you must wait 6 months after any procedure.
